Timeline for Case Submissions

Annual Advances in Business Cases – 2011-2012*

June 23 - 25	Workshop at RIT
September 5	Deadline for mailing revised workshop case with teaching note for Vol 31 Annual Advances consideration. We will be emailing instructions to authors about electronic submissions. However, if you want to submit prior to our getting electronic submission site up and ready, feel free to email submission to the Editor (Leigh W. Cellucci at celluccie@ecu.edu).
September 19	Editor forwards cases to reviewers. If you submitted a case, you can expect to receive a case to review.
October 31	Reviewers return recommendations and comments to the Editor.
November 14	Editor forwards reviewer's recommendations and comments to the submitting author.
December 30	Deadline for authors to submit second revision of the case and teaching notes to the Editor.
January 15	Cases sent out to reviewers for second review.
February 20	Reviewers send their final recommendations and comments to the editor.
March 5	Acceptance/Rejection letters mailed to submitting author(s). In many cases, acceptance will be provisional, pending changes.
April 2	Authors submit final copy to the Editor. Cases that violate Editorial Guidelines at this point will be deferred to the next publication.
